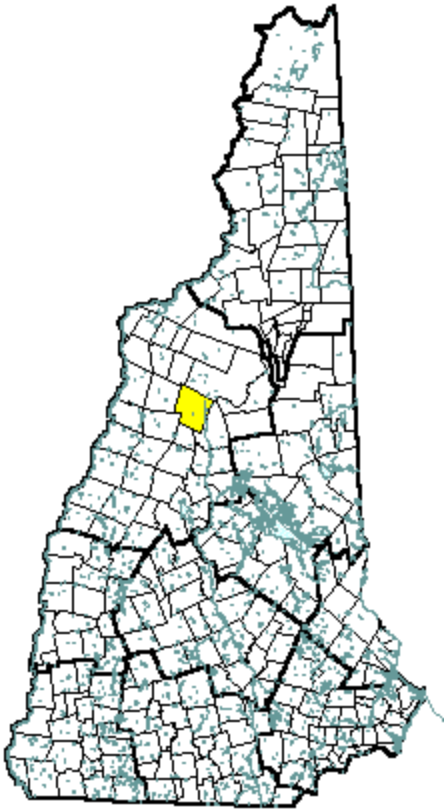

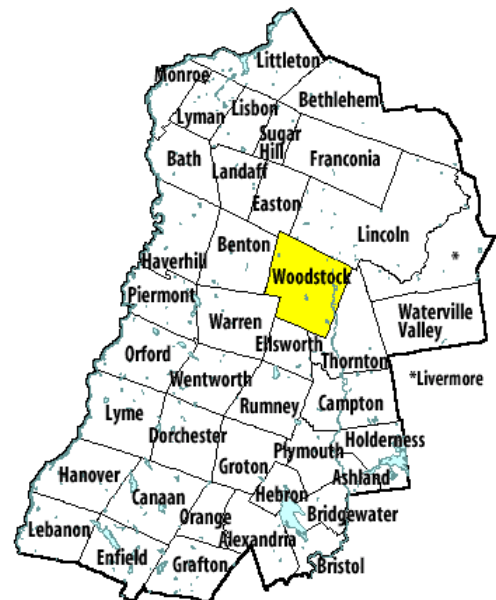

Demographics, 2000 Census: From 1990 to 2000, population in Woodstock decreased by 2.4 percent, losing 28 residents for a total of 1,139. It is one of 24 New Hampshire communities to have lost population since the last census. The median age is 37.1, with 23.8 percent of the population under the age of 18 and 10.3 percent age 65 and older. The total number of households is 500, with an average size of 2.3 persons. Of those, 279 are family households, with an average size of 2.9 persons. As of April 1, 2000, there were 1,279 total housing units.

Population density, 2002: 19.7 persons per square mile of land area. Woodstock contains 58.5 square miles of land area and 0.5 square miles of inland water area.

Origin: First granted in 1763, Governor Benning Wentworth named the town Peeling after an English town. Many of the first colonists were originally from Lebanon, Connecticut. In 1771, Governor John Wentworth gave it the name Fairfield, after Fairfield, Connecticut. The town was renamed Woodstock in 1840, for a historic palace in Woodstock, England.
