Street Numbering Ordinance

An ordinance regulating the assigned numbering of buildings.

All owners, tenants, occupants or persons in possession of primary buildings within the boundaries of the Town of Woodstock shall affix, or cause to have affixed, assigned street numbers, according to the uniform street numbering system adopted by the Board of Selectmen pursuant to their authority as outlined in RSA 231:133-a. The numbers shall be a minimum of three (3) inches high and two and one-half (2 ½) inches wide, contrast with the structure color, and be visible from the road.

For primary buildings not readily visible from the street, the assigned street number(s) shall be conspicuously displayed at the point of entry to the property, so as to be visible on a year-round basis. The preferred method of display at the point of entry shall be on a sign post or by similar means at the point of entry.

Unauthorized Building Numbers Prohibited. No person shall affix or allow to remain upon any building in the Town of Woodstock, New Hampshire, any different number from the one designated by the Board of Selectmen, with the exception of dates affixed for historical purposes.

PENALTY. The owner of any structure existing as of the date of this Ordinance who shall fail to procure and affix street numbers as assigned by the Board within ninety (90) days from the date of this Ordinance, or who shall display an unauthorized number after ninety (90) days from the Effective Date shall be subject to a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), for each day of non-compliance. Fines shall begin to accrue upon the issuance of a written Notice of Violation to the owner, and end at such time as the violation ceases.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect August 1, 1995 at 7:00 p.m.
