**Public Participation/Patrick Griffin:**

The Board reviewed and signed the Intent to Excavate for Caulder Construction.

**Sign Glacial Engery Bills:**

**Minutes of the September 7, 2010 Board Meetings:**

Jim motioned to accept the minutes of September 7, 2010 meeting. Gil seconded the motion and the vote was affirmative.

**Old Business:**

The Water Dept is taking corrective actions including chlorination to eliminate the problem.

The paving on Russell Farm Road has been completed.

Bill is planning on renting a tractor to mow the brush on the sides of all town roads.

The Town of Woodstock will be having a joint meeting with the Town of Lincoln on September 27, 2010 at 5:00pm at the Lincoln Town Hall to discuss Solid Waste Facility issues.
